Community Garden Expansion Planned for Spring

The Mapleton City Council has approved a proposal to expand the community garden located in Riverside Park. The expansion will increase the size of the garden by 50 percent, allowing more residents to reserve plots for growing vegetables and flowers. The decision came after a recent survey revealed that nearly 200 residents were on the waiting list to use the current space.

According to city officials, the expansion project will begin in early April and is expected to be completed by the end of May. The additional land, currently an unused grassy area, will be prepared with soil enhancements and irrigation systems before plots are assigned.

Volunteers are welcome to assist with the garden's preparation. Those interested can register through the city's website starting March 15. In addition, a short orientation session for new participants will be held in the first week of June.

City Council member Karen Wells emphasized that the garden has become a vital part of the local community, not only promoting healthy eating but also encouraging social interaction among residents.
